The energy sector employed 154 people or 0.6% of the islands' total workforce as of November 2015. The islands have 4 diesel plants (around 100 MW and supplying district heating), ...

In December, the Faroe Islands experience wind, rain, and a fleeting sense of sunshine. Temperatures hover between 3°C and 7°C, but with wind chill, for some crystal-clear skies.
